
Grade 6 Activity 2 ∞ & Beyond



Following this, each house presented their 5 minute plays. The plays were judged by Ms. Minakshi Khemka and Ms. Aditi Acharya. The criterian for judgement were as following


- Historical Research and Relevance-5 marks

- Teamwork and Coordination 5 marks


Combining the scores by both judges, maximum marks were 50. Each house took part in the event gracefully and made the event a complete success. After all the houses had presented, the club also organised a short quiz for the audience, in which all students participated enthusiastically.



- 3. Prakash


Overall, the event was extremely fun and an enriching experience for all those who attended it.
